Finally, frame the problem as questions and research objectives.</i>
<b>1.4 Theoretical Framework(s)</b>
<i>Identify the key theoretical framework(s) that inform your research question. Explain how these frameworks will guide your understanding of the problem above.</i>
<b>1.5 Methodology</b>
<i>Outline the methods you plan to use to answer your research question. This can include data collection techniques, participants/informants, analytical tools, and theoretical frameworks you will draw upon. Briefly explain the rationale for your chosen methodology and its suitability for your research project.</i>
<b>1.6 Theoretical and Practical/Managerial Contributions</b>
<i>Explain why your research question is important and worth investigating. Highlight the potential contribution your research will make to existing knowledge, theoretical frameworks, and practical applications. That is, explain how your research will advance theoretical knowledge in your field. Also, discuss the implications of your research for real-world practice.</i>
<b>1.7 References</b>
<i>Include a list of relevant academic references that support your research question, methodology, and the potential significance of your work. Make sure to use correct citation formatting according to the university's requirements.</i>

<i>Provide a realistic timeline for your research, outlining key milestones like proposal defence, data collection, analysis, and writing of thesis chapters.</i>

\*Minimum of 6 and maximum of 10 pages; prioritize the most important information, such as the research problem, research question, methodology, and expected contribution. avoid including extraneous details; use clear and concise language; Communicate your ideas so that it is easy to follow; organize your proposal logically; Use headings and subheadings to break up the text and make it easy for reviewers to find the information they need; Proofread carefully: Make sure your topic proposal is free of typos and grammatical errors.
